State Priorities

The state priorities listed in Education Code sections 52060 and 52066 can be categorized as specified below for planning purposes, however, school districts and county offices of education must address each of the state priorities in their LCAP. (Priority 4)

Other pupil outcomes: pupil outcomes in the subject areas described in Education Code section 51210 and subdivisions (a) to (i), inclusive, of Education Code section 51220, as applicable. (Priority 8)

C. Engagement

Parents are an integral part of the student learning process at our charter school. Families are required to volunteer their time throughout the school year. Director, coordinators and teachers meet with families throughout the year as opportunity for families to provide feedback.		
Another avenue for involvement is through the Charter School Site Alliance. This is comprised of parents, teachers, and staff. This body makes decisions and is frequently involved in discussions that influence policy and direction, including , but not limited to the charter renewal process and IB action plans. We meet once a month during the school year.		
Our school district and our charter site conduct annual family surveys. Many of the eight state priorities, such as academic achievement, school environment and parental involvement are perennial topics in our surveys.		
Loomis Basin Charter School is also accredited by the IB program. Part of the accreditation process is to go through an in depth review of the school's programs with stakeholders and develop an action plan based on input. Stakeholder's input is gathered through staff meetings, Student Site Alliance, staff collaboration, surveys, and PTC. Loomis Basin Charter School received accreditation in 2011 for our Primary Years Program and in 2014 for our Middle Years Program, demonstrating that the process the school engaged in as well as the action plan that was developed was thorough and evidence of progress towards meeting the standards of the IB program were evident. Further, we will continue to be evaluated by IB to ensure our school consistently follows through with action plans and self study review process.

Projected Supplemental Expenditures are \$21,238 for fiscal year 2014-15, \$21,843 for fiscal year 2015-16, and \$22,329 for fiscal year 2016-17. These services include specialized certificated support in the areas of enrichment, intervention, staff development and technology. Although these services are designed and focused for the EL, low income and foster youth students, LBCS will ensure that all students with educational needs are served by these programs.
